NOVEMBER 2005

Here is our latest in new additions. "Bart and Lisa." A kinkajou, lives high in the rainforest canopy of South America. Classified as a carnivore because of skull and teeth structure.

But in the wild, kinkajous live almost entirely on fruit, especially wild figs. They lap supplemental balsamflower nectar with their long tongue. Ecologically, they aren't carnivores.

Kinkajous are nocturnal, only active at night.

At Safari's they eat a mixture of fruits and softened monkey biscuits every day!

For wintering, since they are not adapted to the cold here in Oklahoma, they have their own bedroom in our "wintering home" where we move all the birds, reptiles, some primates, ...etc. They aren't spoiled or anything!
